Banff National Park (BNP) is Canada's first and most visited national park with over 4 million visitors a year. It is unique among national parks because the TransCanada Highway runs through the park and it includes the Town of Banff (population 8,000), the Hamlet of Lake Louise and three ski areas all within the park boundaries.

Have you ever avoided visiting Banff National Park during peak periods because it is overcrowded?

Banff National Park has had to balance human use and conservation throughout its history and today. Banff's vehicle threshold is 24,000 cars a day, but it regularly receives between 27,000 and 34,000 each day during the summer months. This survey will ask for your opinions about some significant proposals that could shift away from vehicle use towards a people and pedestrian friendly environment.

- 2. Aerial transit (a gondola) to the Mt. Norquay Ski Area
- 3. Passenger train service from Calgary to Banff

A. Intercept Parking Lot

There is a vehicle congestion problem in Banff. There is a proposal to create an intercept parking lot at the Banff Train Station.

- The parking lot would be free of charge.
- Shuttles would move people around in town.
- Downtown Banff would be car-free and pedestrian-friendly.

C. Mass Transit Initiatives

Mass transit is critical to decreasing traffic congestion and greenhouse gas emissions. Presently there is no affordable mass transit solution from the Calgary airport to Banff.

There is a proposal to build a dedicated passenger rail line from the Calgary airport to Banff. The rail service:

- would connect directly from the Calgary airport
- would operate up to eight times a day
- would be offered at an affordable rate
- would make stops in a handful of key communities between Calgary and Banff
