Part B: Your thoughts on Banff National Park

Banff National Park (BNP) is Canada's first and most visited national park with over 4 million visitors a year. It is unique among national parks because the TransCanada Highway runs through the park and it includes the Town of Banff (population 8,000), the Hamlet of Lake Louise and three ski areas all within the park boundaries.

Banff National Part has had to balance human use and conservation throughout its history and today. Banff's vehicle threshold is 24,000 cars a day, but it regularly receives between 27,000 and 34,000 each day during the summer months. This survey will ask for your opinions about some significant proposals that could shift away from vehicle use towards a people and pedestrian friendly environment. We want to know your opinion on this opportunity.

Part C: Initiatives

There are three initiatives that together aim to shift BNP toward a less car reliant and more walking and wildlife friendly sustainable environment. They include a transit parking lot, aerial transit to Mt. Norquay Ski Area, and passenger train service from Calgary to Banff.

A. Intercept Parking Lot

There is a vehicle congestion problem in Banff. There is a proposal to create an intercept parking lot at the Banff Train Station, which is a 5-minute walk from downtown. The parking lot would be free of charge. Shuttles would move people around in town. Downtown Banff would be car-free and pedestrian friendly. No public tax dollars would be needed for this initiative.

B. Aerial Transport through the Cascade Wildlife Corridor

The Cascade Wildlife Corridor is important to a variety of wildlife, but currently compromised by a 6-kilometre road to Norquay Ski and Sightseeing area. There is a proposal to build aerial transit (a gondola) from the Town of Banff to Norquay. This would reduce traffic, reduce the lease area of Norquay, and enhance the wildlife corridor.

C. Mass Transit Initiatives

Mass transit is critical to decreasing traffic congestion and greenhouse gas emissions. Presently there is no affordable mass transit solution from the Calgary airport to Banff. There is a proposal to build a dedicated passenger rail line from the Calgary airport to Banff. The rail solution will operate up to eight times a day at an affordable rate, and would make stops in a handful of key communities between Calgary and Banff.
